7--no pictures will be returned but they can be picked up by you or


someone from your area at the conference. Any pictures that remain at the end of the conference will be re-

FOLLOW UP FROM CONFERENCE

Question:

How do you file a BC Society Annual Report when the President's role is filled with more than 1 person?

Answer:

Background:

Section 68 of the Society Act requires every society to file an Annual Report within 30 days after the Annual General Meeting was held. Information you enter in this report must be current as at the close of the annual general meeting.

The annual report filing reminds the society to promptly file any change to the information shown in the Corporate Register. It also tells the Corporate Registry that the society is still active.

Society Act Part 5 - Management, Division 1

Number and residency of Directors

40 - A society must have at least 3 directors and at least one of the directors must be ordinarily resident in BC.

Designation, election, and appointment of Directors

- **42 (2)** To become a Director of a society, other than the first Director, an individual must be elected or appointed to that office in accordance with the bylaws.
 - (3) The bylaws of a society may provide that an individual who holds a particular office or who has a specified attribute is, by virtue of holding that office or having that attribute, appointment as a Director of the society.
 - (4) A designation, election or appointment of a Director is invalid unless
 - **(b)** the designation, election or appointment is made at a meeting that the individual attends and the individual does not refuse, at the meeting, to be a Director.
- **NOTE:** 1 The Annual Report does not ask for the position title, all are designated as Directors.
 - 2 You must check your Bylaws as to what it states regarding the president's position, your auxiliary may be required to change its bylaws or put a resolution on the floor to change for 1 year only.

Answer: From an HCPP perspective, as long as the *volunteer* (whether it is a key volunteer or episodic) is acting within the scope of their volunteer duties at the direction of the organization they would be considered a volunteer.

Excerpts from her closing remarks
